## Cleaning & General Notes

1. Please remember these units are handmade so no two units are identical, we aim to make them look as similar as possible but part of the charm is the differences they have.
2. All units have been sprayed with a clear lacquer to keep the copper looking as bright as possible. If the lacquer is scratched the copper may tarnish.
3. To clean your unit, just simply wipe down with a soapy cloth, try to avoid abrasive scrubs.
4. As with all copper, it will oxidize if exposed to the air. Even with a lacquer applied, a slight darkening of the copper to a more rose gold color may happen over time, nothing to worry about, just adds more to the rustic character.
5. If you plan on not using for a few days, rotate the bottle downwards, if it's firmly "plugged in" it should hold most standard-sized bottles, however if your unsure, open the top valve and main valve empty the pipework and remove the bottle.
6. If not used for a while, run the pipework through with some clean water (keep an old drinks bottle to use with water) and if left for prolonged periods, (and using your spare bottle), clean with Milton Sterilising Fluid, allow the fluid to sit in the pipework for at least 15 minutes, before using it once again.
7. It is not advisable to leave spirits in the pipe for prolonged periods, drain down if not in use, and thoroughly clean if it not used for a while.
